- BAC-DAC to help reach out to/select interns to attend CACB conference: BAC-DAC to provide help and feedback for individuals with regulators and CACB selection criteria
- CACB white paper Our Paper will address the situation facing Foreign Licensed Architects as well as Architectural Graduates as they attempt to find their way to licensure. This paper will then be presented as a workshop which will serve to further the research and broaden proposed options for this important sector of our profession.
- ExAC Support Session: The bulk of the workshop will be dedicated to a panel

- What can/should people do before they come to Canada? Need PR before applying?
- Connect new-comers to BAC-DAC. Guidance for newcomers
  - a. Publications for how much money to expect for wages. Summary expectations is critical to know for interviews
    - Put link to Hays Canada-wide wages summary PDF on Website
  - b. Prepare guide for internationally licensed architects document (new to Canada)
- Andres noted misinformation about the difficulty and the process of path to licensure in Canada
  - a. What are options for employers to employ international architects? (also look at reciprocity agreements and list them on our website)
  - b. Misinformation about time and amount of money it takes to become licensed in Canada (some people think you can do it before you move to Canada and it costs a very small amount of money) - our Path to Licensure diagram aims to address cost and time implications of path options
  - Make it clear that if you're in Canada you cannot call yourself an "Architect" if you are not licensed in Canada (is a protected word; profession is self-regulated)
- BAC-DAC to be a central point for those trying to get on the path to licensure to start with and then get information
  - a. Reach out to regulators, federal and provincial governments to direct them to come to our website and contact us
  - b. Source for people looking for jobs? Can also be difficult for firms to find good people
  - c. Share work from interns/BAC-DAC (instagram?)
- Difficulty getting jobs, particularly for foregin licensed architects:
  - a. Need for training for basic technical requirements (NBC, etc.)
  - Class/seminar on how to design in Canada (considerations envelopes, building codes, bylaws, etc. What do architects do in Canada)
  - c. Andres to identify certain key topics that he trains foreign licensed architects about?
  - d. Inverted job postings platform? (people looking for work)

# 1. Update to Election of Directors

Original Bylaw Verbage:

#### 4.03 Election and Term<sup>10, 11</sup>

Subject to the articles, at the corporation's first meeting of members, directors shall be elected and shall hold office for a three-year term, expiring not later than the close of the third annual meeting of members following the election.

Applicants for the first board of directors must submit a CV evidencing interest and a minimum of two years' previous involvement in endeavours aligning with the vision and mission of the Corporation. All subsequent directors shall be elected to hold office for a two-year term, expiring not later than the close of the second annual meeting of members following the election.

At the close of the second year, and each succeeding annual meeting at which an election of directors is required, up to one-third 1/3 of the initial board of directors may elect to step down, and the members shall elect replacements from a list of pre-qualified applicants.

To qualify, each applicant must submit a CV evidencing interest, previous involvement in endeavours aligning with the vision and mission of the corporation, and have had a minimum of 1 year's experience serving on at least two of the corporation's committees. Directors may apply for further term(s) upon expiry of their first term, but are limited to a maximum of 6 years of service to the corporation.<sup>11</sup>

#### Suggested Revision/Amendment:

#### 4.03 Election and Term<sup>10, 11</sup>

Subject to the articles, at the corporation's first meeting of members, directors shall be elected and shall hold office for a 2-3 year term, expiring not later than the close of the third annual meeting of members following the election, per the following approach:

- At the close of the second year at least half of the initial Directors shall step down, and the members shall elect replacements from a list of pre-qualified applicants.
- At the close of the third year, the remaining initial Directors shall step down, and the members shall elect replacements from a list of pre-qualified applicants.

All subsequent directors shall be elected to hold office for a two-year term, expiring not later than the close of the second annual meeting of members following the election.

Applicants for the first board of directors must submit a CV evidencing interest and a minimum of two years' previous involvement in endeavours aligning with the vision and mission of the Corporation.

Applicants for a Director position in the corporation, not including applicants for a Director position for the first board of directors, must fill in and submit an application form linked on

the corporation's website, including attachment of a CV. The CV is to include any relevant experience in other non-profit organisations, societies, etc., if applicable.

Directors may apply for further term(s) upon expiry of their first term, but are limited to a maximum of 6 years of service to the corporation.<sup>11</sup>

Subject to the articles, the members will elect the directors at the first meeting of members and at each succeeding annual meeting at which an election of directors is required. Special meetings may be called to vote for and elect Directors (see Article 3.04)

# 2. Update to Members Calling a Members' Meeting

Original Verbiage:

### 3.04 Members Calling a Members' Meeting

The board of directors shall call a special meeting of members in accordance with Section 167 of the Act, on written requisition by members carrying not less than 5% of the voting rights. If the directors do not call a meeting within twenty-one (21) days of receiving such requisition, any signatory to the requisition may call the meeting.

#### **Suggested Revision/Amendment:**

### 3.04 Members Calling a Members' Meeting

The board of directors shall call a special meeting of members in accordance with Section 167 of the Act, on written requisition by members carrying not less than 5% of the voting rights, or as brought forward by Directors and voted for/approved by members (by majority vote) at an annual meeting of members. If the directors do not call a meeting within twenty-one (21) days of receiving such requisition, with the exception of special meetings that have already been assigned a specific later date for, any signatory to the requisition may call the meeting.
